Leonna is a girl from the merchant class in Lemuria which is somewhere in the Pacific Northwest. She takes part in the Betram festival in which all the unbonded Lemurians let their beasts run free and rut uncontrollably. Of course, she runs into Prince Nicholai though she hides her identity from him.

Both Leonna and Nicholai have issues with their families, yet they still seek each other out though Nicholai isn't sure who Leonna really is. Fortunately, she's also an artist and he unknowingly commissions her to paint his portrait.

I found this short novella fairly confusing. It takes place in the Pacific Northwest about six hundred years ago, though they seem to pass through portals and come from another planet. There are other beasts that the Lemurians fight against to protect humans? who don't appear in the story. There are a lot of side plots to do with Nicholai's brother and Leonna's betrothal, none of which made much sense and are resolved fairly easily and predictably. There were also some anachronisms in speech that were irritating if this story took place so long ago. The story has potential, but relies heavily on sex as the main impetus without much else to show why the two main characters are involved with each other. It might be interesting to see if a full length book could resolve some of these issues.

Unforgettable Lover by Rosalie Redd is the prequel novella to the Worlds of Lemuria: Earth Colony Series. Set in the Pacific Northwest, this Novella is about Prince Nicholai, one of the two princes of Lemuria, and Leonna, a merchant's daughter. At the beginning of the story, the Lenurian colony is preparing for Betram, a holiday for the shifters that occurs every 30 years or so when the full moon and the summer solstice occur on the same day. During this holiday, all unbonded male and female Lenurians are free to change into their beast and mate with anyone they choose with no strings attached. They are to remain anonymous, even if they choose to not change. Neither Nicholai nor Leonna are looking for a bond, which is one of the reasons they decided to remain in human form. However, after their night of mating, they just can't seem to stop thinking about each other.

This is a very intriguing story. I rarely read novellas, but I'm glad I took a chance on this one, because I was impressed with the character and story development. It was impossible for me to put this book down, because not only is it a romance, it also has many other things going on, like a struggle to become crown prince, family relationships, and arranged marriages. I could not find anything I didn't like about it. I will definitely be reading more by this author. I can't wait to see what happens next.

In the prequel to the Warriors of Lemuria series, Prince Nikolai is one of the strongest warriors of the Stiyaha (a shape-shifting race from another planet sent to earth to battle the evil Gossoms), and he lives his life around duty and responsibility. He fears he will fail the people he cares for, which prohibits him from making many friends and taking a mate.

Leonna yearns for freedom. The responsibility of her family's honey-making business weighs heavily on her shoulders, and all she wants to do with her life is paint. Though she's looking forward to the Betram ritual—a sexual rite all unbonded Stiyaha males and females must attend, to help them find mates—she doesn't want a mate, at least until she meets Nikolai. Though both of them are wearing disguises, she recognizes him as the future king and believes they can never be together beyond the Betram.

I really liked Nikolai and Leonna. They're both hardworking, loyal people who are trapped under their families' expectations and needs, and I think their plight could speak to a lot of readers.

Though I enjoyed the story and understood the environment/world in which the characters lived, I'm relieved I've already read book one in the series. The first book just gave much more detailed information about the world than this novella did. The writing is strong, but there were a few minor typos. Since this story takes place 600 years ago, in the 1400s, I was surprised the characters spoke like people from contemporary times, and not in more old-fashioned terms.

Anyway, it's a good story, and I look forward to reading more from Ms. Redd.
