This is a mixture of International Intrigue, Historical Fiction, and Medicine genres.

Hugo Reese, a former gang member, is in Spain visiting relatives. As he is traveling to his next destination his world is turned upside down. He is no longer a visitor but a wanted criminal and he has no clue how to clear his name. Elsewhere, a group of colorful doctors have plans that may or may not be for the good of the world.

I really liked how the authors have interspersed the backstory for the main characters. I have a feeling this will become important as the stories unfold.

After another bloodbath, tired of all the violence he goes to Spain to visit his family in search of a bit of tranquility and maybe to start a new peaceful and quiet life. In a train he meet a famous virologist on its way to a conference in Madrid to present a breakthrough study about one of the worst virus in history that killed millions of people 100 years ago (I've lost several members of my family in the pandemic Spanish Flu). Unfortunately for Hugo a well organized terrorist group wants to grab the doctor's work and is willing to kill and destroy everything on the way to getting it, starting with bombing that precise train... Hugo survives the explosion taking the doctor's iPad and soon he sees himself chased by the terrorists and also by the cops that believe he is one of the responsibles for the attack, his only hope is trusting his life in a group of anti-establishment renegade he just met...

This book was a great surprise! The story is really good, with non stop action and thrills, very well written the society descriptions are awesome and super complete (it's set on a near future, with some political differences and a much more controlling governments - very plausible and probable by the way) and the thing I liked the most was the character construction, there's a lot of them but all are well presented and the

stories merge in a intelligent way. I specially liked all the background about Jamall and the terrorist group (really amazing and scary stuff) and I trully loved reading the secret diary of a US army medic that testified the outbreak of the Spanish Flu back in 1918.

Two days ago I've picked this one randomly on my Kindle (had downloaded it for free several months ago) just to kill some time on a sunny afternoon by the pool and I couldn't put it down and yesterday night I wasn't able to stop reading until I reach the end, and that's exactly the thing I expect on a thriller book! I'll definitely will read the next installment "Red Horse" and I hope the authors release all the four horses of the apocalypse with the same quality, I think I'll collect them all...
