Combine elements from my favorite *Disney* movie with a linebacker who is referred to as "The Beast" on the field and a fantastic heroine with her sixteen month old daughter and this made for a win-win read for me. I had a blast reading this story. I loved the characters, the writing and thought the author did a stellar job. Though the story isn't necessarily epic per say, I can't think of anything I would add or eliminate and so this

story gets a 5 Star rating from me.

Piper Madison has taken a job at her father's sport's agency and has been given the task of getting the dirtiest player in the league, Cole Hawthorne to agree to a trade or she will lose her job.

"Cole Hawthorne was a beast. A monster. A huge, lumbering slab of muscle and rage. And he was the most gorgeous man I'd ever laid eyes on."

Getting Cole to agree to a trade is a task that is so much harder than she ever realized.

The interactions and chemistry between Piper and Cole was fantastically written and once her daughter Rose enters the picture the level of adorable is added to the mix.

This was very tough for me to rate. There were some things I really loved; some things I really disliked.

What I loved:

--the interactions between Cole (the H) and Rose (the h's baby girl). It was heartwarming and adorable
--the few scenes where Cole and Piper (the h) were affectionate and sweet with each other, with no fighting.
--the one sex scene where Cole actually experiences real intimacy. That was a great one. I liked how pivotal it was for Cole. Connected to that-
--I liked how Cole experienced love and what it felt like to be loved. All of that was very sweet and touching
--the football game sequences were exciting and fun to read
--Cole speaking out for and trying to protect and help Piper with both her dad, and later the baby daddy.
Love a protective alpha male!!! :D

What I really disliked:

--the first couple of sex scenes were awful for me. As friends of mine here know, one of the most important things for me in a romance is that sex be equally special for the h and H. In these couple of scenes, Cole just basically behaved with Piper the way he had with all OW he'd been with. I just pictured her as nothing different. Meanwhile, she said it was the best night of her life. gag. That may be because - (read next point)
--Piper didn't have much sexual experience. In fact, I may have missed something, but I think she might have only had sex once, with her baby daddy. So, basically Cole had a lot of past sex compared to her and when he behaved like he did with all women, it just didn't work for me.
--references to Cole's sexual past. Things like: having sex was his favorite way to unwind after a football game; how he had pleased many women by giving them the Beast they wanted in bed. How some women sought him out so they could get that exhilarating experience of being with a dominant, aggressive, strong guy (again, this made me feel how not special sex with Piper was **at first**)
--the constant pushing away that Cole did
--the fact that Piper had to basically chase after him throughout the entire book, even at the very end. I wanted him to come to her, after the way he had pushed her away. Even understanding his emotional state, I didn't like it. If you are a reader who wants the guy to chase, I would not recommend this book. Cole never chases.
--Piper's crappy father got off really easy in my opinion. Hated that.

And then the second half starts...

Second Half

It all goes to hell. Gone is the funny. The cute is too sparse to GAF. Enter the melodrama, troupe, and tripe.

Beast

I get it already. OMG "beast" is used 73 times and "monster" 38 times over less than 250 pages. Enough. Move on. Too much analysis and over-play of the beauty and beast theme.

Sex

The first sex scene is horrible:

- he treats her like all OW he went beast-mode with in bed.
- they go to separate rooms acting like nothing changed between them.
- no protection used for what both consider a one-off. Unreal considering she's already had one life-altering one night stand that landed her pregnant w/ a baby she struggles to support.

- too much telling, too much focus on *thinking and analyzing* what's going on, and too much grey prose on the technicalities of "beast-mode fucking." It's not a thesis kind'a event, authors!

Second sex scene is almost as bad. He leaves angry and felling kicked because his feelings are hurt that she *likes beast-mode fucking* .. As if she only wants his dick now. GMAFB.

I've read almost all of Sosie Frost's books and I have to say that this one is my favorite so far. I rated it a 3 star but it's actually a strong **3.4/5 stars**. This book isn't without its flaws. It's still cheesy as fuck but I actually enjoyed the book, loved the cliche plot and I was totally immersed in it. I literally finished it in 1 hour? Maybe an hour and a half?

Beauty and the Blitz is obviously inspired by the fairy tale *Beauty and the Beast*, but I can't really recall much reference from the old fairy-tale besides the fact that the Hero, Cole Hawthorne, calls himself *The Beast* and has a dark past. Now, the nickname actually has two connotations in the book: #1) Cole's persona in the field #2) Cole's description of his violent self. There's also the huge castle. Does that count?

Cole is notorious for his violence streak in the field and he's also Atwood Monarchs's best linebacker. But because of his *Beastly* persona, he's in danger of losing his position in his the team.

"After one hundred thousand dollar fines last year, I got their message loud and clear. They hailed me as the best linebacker in the game, and then they punished me for becoming The Beast ---the all-pro defensive MVP for my three seasons in the league."

But the problem with Cole is that his violence tendencies really runs deep. For him, **The Beast** isn't just his public persona. It is *literally* him. It's really all he's ever known.

I couldn't switch in and out of that mindset. The Beast was me, something impossible to control on the field.

And lately...just as hard to tame outside the game.

(view spoiler) I really wanted to know more of Cole's *dark* past because it plays an integral part on making him the way he is, but alas, his past is very much glossed over. I wanted to know what *really* happened to him, that made him a loner -- what really made him think he was prone to violence?

I'd really love for the Beast nickname to be explored that *way* instead of having it being used so awkwardly in some of the sex scenes in this book.

"Do you?" His voice lowered. "You want The Beast?"

"Yes."

"I'm not afraid of you, Cole." I whispered the words, clipped and broken so near to his lips.

"I can handle a little beast."
