Bringer of Justice by V. C. Angelo is a first reads win and I'm giving my honest opinion. Vie finds himself on a different planet when he comes through the portal. He's on Reini and the people are known as Reini. The king of the land has an irrational hatred for magic wielders. He is immediately set upon by slavers. He tries a magic trick to free himself which goes haywire. What was supposed to be little turned out to be huge. Then a gateway appears and he is urged to jump thru. Vie meets the magic wielders who have been driven away from the city and each summer the king attacks and kills more. It is a law in the land. If you use magic you lose it as soon as you pick up a sword. Vie is a mystery, he's a fighter and uses magic. His type of magic is different. He calls it Herrick magic. I received a free copy of this book through the Goodreads First Reads Giveaway. Vir, a warrior from the land of Munerel with magical powers, escapes a group of slavers chasing him through a portal opened for him by magic-using Reini people of New Seersha. The Reini had been driven out by King Kellum, who wants to destroy all magic. The Reini and King Kellum immediately begin to believe that Vir may be the legendary "Bringer of Justice," a mighty warrior who is also strong in magical abilities, and will save the Reini from the King. Vir isn't so sure he is the one to fulfill the prophecy, so he is torn between trying to find a portal

back to his own home, or committing himself to help the Reini escape the king's clutches. With a scheming, conniving right-hand man to the king whose secret girlfriend has infiltrated the Reini to stop Vir, and the inevitability of an attack by the King's army as soon as winter ends, there's plenty of intrigue and suspense to keep the story interesting. The belief system and back story of the Reini are conveyed mostly through fables shared by the storytellers of the tribe. Angell does a good job of world-building and character development, so it will be interesting to see where he takes this series next.
