A must for every Christie fan, this facsimile edition was published in 2014. It includes six stories and five stories first published under Star over Bethlehem, illustrated by Elsie Wrigley by Collins in 1965. This special edition also includes A Masque from Italy, Seven ballads and eighteen poems first published in The Roads of Dreams published by Geoffrey Bles in 1924 and 28 poems published under Poems by Collins in 1973. The poems and ballads are not quite enjoyable nor are the short stories. But taken together we get to see a very different aspect of the Queen of mystery. Must read for all Christie fans.

Generally very good and interesting to see this other side of Christie. Some of the stories & poems got a little too esoteric for me.

As with most short story collections, this one had some hits and misses for me, but overall I enjoyed reading something different than what I'm used to reading from Agatha Christie.

I'd say only about 1/3 of the material here specifically revolves around Christmas, but the rest is at least religious. From what I can find out, Christie was a member of the Church of England, and her perspective is more "high church" than mine, but I still found it interesting. Although, there were a few instances of religious fiction that I didn't really care for, such as in "The Island" which seems to imply that Mary was rather ignorant about who her own son Jesus really was, which makes no sense to me (still a neat idea for a story though).

"Promotion in the Highest" at times vaguely reminded me of That Hideous Strength with "returned saints" walking around earth much like C.S. Lewis's version of Merlin (though the effects and reasons were very different).

I'm really not sure how I feel about this compilation. Some of it is truly beautiful, others intriguing, and some...well, some are just a bit odd. I loved the parable of the boy in the garden, though.

3.5 stars. There were some real gems in this collection of short stories and poems by the Queen of Crime.

Some hits, some misses, but surprising overall, and quite beautiful in places.

This is a side of Agatha Christie that was previously unknown to me.

I am familiar, as a lot of readers are, with her stories and novels with Jane Marple, Hercule Poirot and Tommy and Tuppence. But these stories on a Christmas theme and her poems were a refreshing change.

I loved the way Christie took the Biblical information about the Nativity and Passiontide stories and linked them together at the time of Jesus' birth. It gave a different interpretation of how Mary felt as a new mother, especially to the infant Christ-child, and how she felt about realising that her son was to end his life in such a hideous fashion. I also loved the way the animals were portrayed, along with the various, dare I say, 'bit part characters' of the shepherds, wise men and angels.

The poetry, however, I'm not sure about. Some of the poems were lovely and flowed rhythmically, but others I found were rather too deep for me. Maybe I'm just not much of a poetry person, but I like poems that flow nicely and tell a more obvious story.

An altogether interesting and different type of book from one of our best authors.
