Wiersbe has put together a fantastically structured small group study guide. Each chapter reminds you to pray for God to open up His truth as you read His Word, and then sends you straight to the Scripture to read it for yourself. Before you dive into the questions related to the chapter, you're asked to write down a verse that you never noticed before, one that puzzled you or made you think. This technique introduces you to one of the best habits to get into with Scripture... to keep digging for treasure, and it's also a great way to jump start discussions in a small group setting.

The only caviat I had with this book is the numerous references it made to the connected "BE" commentary. I think if the commentary really was essential to the study, it may have made sense to just make this book a bit bigger and include the full passages alongside the small group questions.
