Overall, **I Kissed a Girl** was an enjoyable read, but it did have a few moments, and stories that took the pleasure of reading it away.

A glaring problem was found on page 19, (In PDF format) where it suddenly says, END EXCERPT...which really took me out of the story that I was reading.

Interestingly enough, it was one of the stories I really felt just was not as pleasurable to read. I found the second story, **Two's Company** by Louisa Bacio to be just a bit too dry for my taste, and it didn't seem natural when the lead character Trisha suddenly kisses the "girl" of her dreams. It comes after a long intro of a former playmate for Trisha, that she had been involved in three- and -four ways with.

However, the first story really sizzled in my opinion. **Freckles** by C. Margery Kempe was a delight to read right from the start. The female characters, Lea and Bridey felt very natural in each aspect that they were presented in. Even Keegan, the male character felt pretty natural, but you'll have to read this story to actually understand why I say this.

This threesome made sense. The lesbian pairing felt natural. Ms. Kempe did a fine job of setting up such a short story for a quick and enjoyable romp.

The next story that really sizzled for me was **Champagne** by Inara LaVey. The male “lead” Daryl was very much the snob one expected from a self styled “connoisseur” of wines. His girlfriend Jeannette is a woman who has sexual wants and desires and finds that Daryl is too wrapped up in his “wine tasting” to pay attention to her. When he does, it is to be very condescending to her over even the trivial of matters. She has endured his lectures of the taste and everything about wine and is now set to have three days at the “Roux-Dubois” winery. Considered to be one of the finest in France, Jeannette is not ready for the expected snobbery of their hosts. Little does she know... You’ll have to read to find out what happened.

The Tiger’s Tale by Kilt Kilpatrick was another one that just didn’t ring true for me. It was too fanciful in one sense for me..and I had a difficult time trying to figure out how to say either lead females names. Okay, more of the “*Indian or Hindu*” name which was Vijaya. Elspeth, I just kept wanting to call her Elisabeth. (I tend to pronounce names in my head. Bad habit) The tiger becomes a God in human form just didn’t do it for me. This was supposed to be a Lesbian anthology, and yet this story had more about the heterosexual sex in it than the lesbian.

Again, I would say that overall, **I Kissed a Girl** is an anthology that is worth reading. I would read it again, but I would skip the ones that I know I did not enjoy. As my husband said only a short bit ago, “*To each his [her] own.*” What I liked, you may not and what I did not enjoy, may bring you pleasure.
