Anyway, it begins quoting two favorites, Ansel Adams, and Milan Kundera, one about photos, the other about dogs. Both interesting in their own way. I had never seen any of Ashers work so I didn't know what to expect, but for most parts this turned out to be an excellent book. The first shot for example is a terrific shot of a Great Dane hugging a woman, and then we get the backstory behind the photo which makes it even more interesting.

The next shot is a costume shot of a standard Poodle with a hat tending a bar. Throughout the book there are the occasional shots like this one, dogs in costumes. These photos are cute, but somehow I just don't like them as much as the ones that show dogs without the props, and costumes. To me they drag the over all look of the book down a little bit because they are just cute shots, they don't show the dog in its own element.

Luckily, the great ones, like a shot a few pages further on of a black Labrador and a Golden Retriever together, echoing each other, are strong enough to make it interesting combined with the little story about each shot. Some of these stories are funny, while others are interesting or sad like the one of the girl that had recently lost both parents. The photo of her, and her Golden Retriever is one of the great photos that is in this book.

All in all, I think I can say this is a very good book. One that I would like to own a print copy of, but I think it is only available in a kindle version.
