I was impressed, to say the least. I didn't have very high expectations for this novel, after my experience with the first two Metal Gear Solid novels. The first two novels weren't bad, by any means, but they read like very accurate representations of the first two games, and although I enjoyed those novels, they lacked a voice of their own, in my opinion.

This was different. From the outset the novel was a unique read. I enjoyed the explanations because I felt they did well to tie the first three Metal Gear Solid games in with this novel. The explanations acted as a bridge to understanding. However, a new reader to the Metal Gear series would probably be a bit flummoxed with the number of new characters introduced in this story, which could put them off.

As I continued to read the story slowly unfolded. The action speeded up and there was more to make this story stand out, on its own merits. It had a voice, and a unique message to readers, which felt characteristic of the Metal Gear video games, and which I liked greatly.

The feeling at the end was of satisfaction. I have never played the Metal Gear Solid 4 videogame, but I felt this book answered the questions posed in all three previous games. The same feeling of elation and absorbing interest that I had experienced with those three games was mirrored in this novel. If you want to read a great Metal Gear novel then this is the one. If new readers can get used to the unfamiliar names in the first half of the book then they will probably be interested in the conclusion in this story, which is very interesting and well ... epic.

Metal Gear Solid 4 was a shoddily written "ending" to a series in a direction it wasn't really supposed to go, so the story is full of melodrama and over-the-top sequences to really hammer in that the canon timeline is over. That being said, Project Itoh gives a great take on Hideo Kojima's wrap-up conclusion to the saga, and even throws in a creative angle by giving the main narration to Snake's partner Otacon. It was a fun read for me, knowing where it would end, and much better than the Benson novels of MGS and Sons of Liberty.

If you're a fan of the series, this is a fun read. If you're not, maybe avoid this one. It's hit or miss. Especially if you don't know what the MGS series is about or where it has come up to this point it won't be all that entertaining for you.

The Metal Gear Solid series of games are my favourite work of fiction. The story is astoundingly ambitious, taking place over 50 years and asking questions about war, patriotism, economics, subtle control of the public, genetic and memetic inheritance, and many other things. It's set in a world in which a handful of people determine world events, and where a secret cold war plays out between two groups with different responses to the same guiding principle - that soldiers should not be carelessly made to throw their lives away.

I wouldn't ordinarily read a novelization of something I've already experienced in another medium, but I was struck by the story of the author and wanted to read his take on the story.

Keikaku "Project" Itoh was a devoted fan of Hideo Kojima (the creator of MGS) and from his earnestness in the afterword it's clear that he wanted to produce something both respectful and fresh. He fought a battle with cancer throughout his career as a novelist, and died not long after this was published, aged 35. It's touching that the story of Snake - a prematurely aged man on the verge of death, struggling against his body to finish his work - parallels this. MGS ruminates a lot on the idea of legacy, forming connections between individuals and memories in those we touch, and how a person can face death. It has a authenticity here, coming from a young man who had already come close to death.

The writing style is heavy on exposition of characters' inner worlds. It's not an approach that I would generally like but I find that it works here. As I'm already familiar with the story of the games (though as I've

played them I have struggled to understand it) the natural aspect to expand on would be characters' thoughts and motivations. Snake, Raiden, and especially Otacon (the narrator) are more fleshed out, after reading this.

As a fan of the series, I enjoyed the book. It is primarily the story of MGS4, but also contains elements of the original MSX games and MGS 1, 2 and 3. It combines together, and explains well, a complex story. For me, it's a good complement to the games, rather than a re-telling of the same thing.

I'm not sure if I would recommend it to someone completely unfamiliar with MGS, but for someone who has played one or two of the games and is curious about the larger story, or someone who wants to catch up before the release of MGS5, I think it's a good read.
