My problem with the book is two fold: first, I have a personal affinity against one member of a couple being the parent of a small child. I would have preferred that Lynay Grant be a recently terminated struggling student suffering from severe bouts of asthma; secondly, the primary villain, Allision, Major Tyson Bradford's ex-wife is unnecessarily reduced from an educated military brat who cheated on her husband and now wants him back to a crazy bigoted whore who will sleep with one in a uniform. This characterization of Allision doesn't fit the kind of woman Tyson would have married considering his obsession with fidelity due his mother's unfaithfulness to his father. The other elements of the story were great, both Tyson and Lynay had dated outside their respective races and being an interracial couple was not an issue for them.
