I gave this 4 stars for 2 reasons, one because it consists of four books or novellas that had been published already and it does not contain book five which may wrap up this series.

Rylie is the female alpha of the werewolf pack and working to get them settled into a new home where hopefully they will be safe. Seth, the boy she loves is in school and Able, his brother is with her and is the quasi co-alpha. Rylie has mixed feelings about Abel and goes looking for Seth who has left school and is looking for someone or something. After finding Seth, she and Seth are taken prisoner by Eleanor, Seth and Abel's mother who Rylie thought she had already killed and find a step-brother Cain who seems determined to kill all the werewolves. A added problem is Rylie thinks she is pregnant and while Seth is the only one she is sure she has had sex with, she is not sure if anything happened while she and Abel were in their wolf forms.

While the story was good with some plot twists, it was a bit jerky and would have been better with book five

included but still a good read with an interesting cliff hanger at the end of book 4.
