Working with Christa Malleson, a woman with remarkable mental abilities and a mysterious defector from the rogue organization that wants to control humanity's free will, Mitchell uncovers a sinister plot that has not only seeped into the highest levels of the military and government bureaucracy, but into U.S. security agencies.

The main characters in "The Siren Project" are all realistic and memorable. I loved the undaunting determination of the pragmatic John Mitchell, the humor and wit of Mouse, the dedication and subtle intellect of Gunter and Christa and especially EB the created intelligence who is a chief advocate in overcoming the evil of the organization.

The story is filled with exciting twists and turns, as Mitchell and his team struggle not only to bring the perpetrators of the insidious conspiracy to justice, but to escape the long arm of coldblooded assassins out to kill them.
