Madeline is just not my cup of tea. That is certainly just a preference thing. I don't care for sexually aggressive/abrasive h's so Maddie is all that and I had trouble relating to her. I will admit by the end we got to see her heart and I warmed up to her...some.

After thinking on this for awhile, I finally decided to give it a relatively high rating, even though I had mixed feelings/emotions when I read it. Overall, I think it deserves the 4 star -- and in fact, most people will likely rate it higher!

My thoughts:

(1) Maddie: She was extremely abrasive and unlikable in some ways, but then on the other hand, she was also someone I felt extremely sympathetic towards. Even while I felt sympathy for her, she wasn't someone I could imagine ever wanting to be anywhere near -- until about 60% of the way into the book. At heart, she was a really good person; she just took a long time to become likable imo. She did evolve over time and thankfully, even her negative personality traits actually took on a positive aspect when the tribe ended up facing a catastrophe.

(2) Hassen: I didn't like that he initially wanted Lila, but I did get past that as he pretty quickly saw that he liked Maddie's personality better. However, I didn't like how beta he came off, but then again, in this series, only one man really gets to be alpha, and that is Vektal. I kind of hate that these men all have to basically bow down to Vektal because they simply don't have any choice. They are a small tribe and if you don't want to live alone, you have no options. You can't just go out and pave your own path. Only Rukh did that, but it wasn't by choice. He grew up alone. I just found that Hassen came off as even more beta than many of the others.

I am torn over whether or not he deserved the exile. It seemed like he just had the bad misfortune to have his abduction of Lila not pay off the way it did for Rukh and Rahosh with their mates.

I also didn't exactly like that he wasn't always 100% focused on Maddie's happiness. He was often very focused on his own issues and heartache. That was realistic -- and really understandable, especially after the tragedy, but I have gotten used to these blue guys being all about their mates!! I did love Hassen's totally selfless commitment to his tribe, and Maddie much of the time as well. Despite his awful move in the previous book, he really was a very good guy at heart. And he was very noble and brave.

(3) I have mixed feelings about the development of the relationship between Maddie and Hassen. It really seemed like just a regular relationship you would find in a contemporary romance. There was no magical element, no resonance until almost the end. While that had some pluses -- and should please people who enjoy slow-burn with no insta-love/insta-lust, it also detracted from the intensity I have enjoyed about the other relationships in this series.

(4) I was disturbed by Maddie's bargaining (towards the end) for an end to Hassen's exile. It was admirable that she went to bat for him, but to withhold information that could literally save the lives of all the tribe if she hadn't gotten her way?? UGh. That is pretty crappy. And the thing is: there is no way Hassen would have withheld that information (if push came to shove), so thank goodness for that!
