“Caitlin Star and the Rise of the Barbarians” takes place after an apocalyptic event where most of the Earth’s temperate have become uninhabitable and the remaining human population is estimated to be about 100 million. Exactly how that apocalyptic event came to be is one of the story lines of the first two “Caitlin Star” books, especially book two, “Caitlin Star” and the *Guardian of Forever*”. Reading those books certainly is not necessary to enjoy “Caitlin Star and the rise of the Barbarians”. It really does function as a stand-alone adventure as the author skillfully peppers in all the backstory that you need. But that being said, the three “Caitlin Star” books do form a loose trilogy of sorts, and the first two books are very good, so I highly recommend reading those as well.

What I loved most about this book the journey of the “Caitlin Star” character as she evolves (or devolves depending on your viewpoint) into the “Queen of the Forest” and the protector of a sort of Garden of Eden, the last remaining pristine patch of nature left on earth. Soon, enemies attack and how Caitlin and her over-matched friends of the forest deal with this makes for a riveting, action-packed science fiction action adventure.

I won this a paperback copy of this action-packed novel which turned out to be a real gem. Caitlin is a physically and mentally strong character who has her own initiative and gets things done without bitching and whining. She is a pleasure to witness as she is dependant on her own very skilled abilities and mental prowess and does not back down from a fight as she is a Bull Mongoni warrior, trained by the phenomenal Gunner Star. Also, she is nothing like the usual female YA leads as she embraces her role and enjoys proving her calibre.

Chapters switch between several characters mainly Caitlin and Gunner as they are in two very different periods of time. Gunner is in the B.C era due to a time machine as they are in hunt of an enemy who is changing the outcome of history. Most of the supporting characters aren't human but are in fact chimpanzees and gorillas who are surprisingly, beautifully developed and are fond of Caitlin despite her being human.

The plot is intriguing and the post-apocalyptic element is a nice bonus along with the time travel. There was definitely a lot of action which was written perfectly as the descriptions brought life to the scene. The fact there was no cringe infested romances was a great change with just tiny hints of it and the vulgarity in the book was slightly refreshing as nothing was censored and revealed the true ugliness of things. Also, the superhero references was a welcome aspect as *The Birds Of Prey* were mentioned and *Lex Luthor*.

The only problem with the plot was the lack of surprise as there was no real sense of danger like I knew no one important was going to die and I always knew things were going to turn out for the better in the end minus a tiny detail which still really was positive.

Also, there was quite a lot of spelling mistakes which were hard to ignore, in total I counted 11, like:

"When they first came her five years ago.."

"She everything she possibly could from the inside.."

Overall, I definitely enjoyed the book especially because it didn't follow any stereotypes and I'm definitely going to invest in the other books.

Impressive, fast-paced, visceral, contemporary post-apocalyptic science fiction action adventure with a great title character and strong visual writing.

Many things set this book (and its prequels, "Caitlin Star" and "Caitlin Star and the Guardian of Forever") apart from the monstrous avalanche of young adult/new adult dystopian fiction out there. Unlike most of the YA dystopian female leads, Caitlin is not a reluctant action hero. Protecting others, seeking justice, and taking on the villains (well-fleshed out, worthy adversaries in all three books), is something she seems born too. As a matter of fact, at times she relishes it. There is a primal, savage beauty seeing Caitlin in action. She is fearsome, a character whose charisma just oozes off the page amid the author's streaming pulpy prose.

There is also a unique multi-layered approach in the book's thematic subtext that works on a cultural, political, sociological, and even religious level. The addition of a priest to Caitlin's supporting cast here is a stroke of genius. The non-human characters, especially Toby (a chimpanzee) and Krell (a neanderthal-like hominid) are very well developed. Returning from the previous books is Caitlin's hacker friend Lori as well as few special surprises best not spoiled here.

The science in this book is also well done, and I say this as an undergraduate student of Anthropology and Archaeology. The imagined pre-history is entirely possible. Only the time-travel device comes across as science fiction-y (for lack of a better word). But even that is within the outer realm of possible quantum mechanics.

But make no mistake, "Caitlin Star and the Rise of the Barbarians" is not an academic study. It is an exhilarating, page-turning, ultra-intense action adventure with unforgettable scenes, magical moments, and an iconic lead character named "Caitlin Star".

I was surprised to see how well all of it was integrated and even though I usually enjoy some slower and more detailed works more, such cute action-packed jungle post-apocalyptic adventure was hard not to enjoy. I would recommend it to all Tarzan enthusiasts out there, since Caitlin might just be his reincarnation, other than being his fan as well.

This being my first Caitlin Star novel and having missed a lot of her character's development so far, I felt she was more or less one-dimensional for the most part in the first half of the story, except for her interactions with Toby and his friends. Later on, as she met Krell and her best friend, Lori, she finally got some strong development and I realised I really liked her. Even before those events, she was a likeable character, but after showing a different side of her, her average-girl-hanging-out-with-her-friend side, I began feeling her more and she really grew on me bit by bit throughout the novel.

I like how the common prejudicial image that would accompany her outward appearance--I guess just based on the cover art, which is by the way great and made by the author himself--is in a contrast to who she actually is. Although her name is very simple and the least cool name compared to the names of all the other characters and her aesthetics not really uncommon--she was glorious, unique, extravagant and brutal; the star in her name and her heart shed the brightest of lights. I would love to know more about this Star.

The only other character that stood out to me was Toby, the chimpanzee. I found his and the roles of the other chimpanzees very sweet and the way they all communicated with Caitlin impressive and cute. I wish there were more animals as important characters in novels.
