The pattern layout is a little frustrating, and I'm not quite sure I understand the stitching instructions, but then, I haven't tried to use them yet. Sometimes instructions are much easier to follow than they are to read. Not sure how these would translate using cotton thread instead of crewel wool. I especially liked the Jacobean leaf & flower patterns. 2.5 stars.
