Meet Charles Longstreet. During the Civil War, he was involved in a shoot out with John Sturman. Just after Sturman dies, three of his friends enter the saloon and challenge Charles. With Cole Younger and Ned Buntline backing him, Charles shoots all three of the challengers. Little did he know that Ned was a reporter and would be writing a story about him.

After the war ended, Charles heads to Virginia City to help his brother Bob. Along the way he is challenged to numerous gunfights, and also helps a lot of people who are in tough situations. After one such shootout, he finds out from the sheriff of the dime novel that Ned had written. He curses Ned for the problems he has caused.

I love westerns but I had never written one before. Knowing that it would be very different from anything I've written I decided to go ahead with the project. With that decision made, I sat down and began to ponder what I would write about. After a night of tossing and turning I had an idea. I decided that my hero would have a name with the word "Kid" in it. So I tried thinking of a name I could put in front of "Kid", like the Sundance Kid or the Cisco Kid and - well you get the idea. It took a while because all of the names I came up with had been used in movies. But after much research I discovered a little known Civil War battle that took place in the little town of Lone Jack, Missouri. Thus the Lone Jack Kid was about to be born.

When I read that Frank James, Cole Younger, Bloody Bill Anderson and Quantrill all were directly or indirectly involved in that battle, that got my attention. Cole Younger displayed an act of bravery when he rode between the battle lines delivering ammunition to the Rebels while the Yankees kept shooting blistering volleys at him. Two bullets cut through his clothing and came close to killing him.
