This is another entertaining Miss Seeton story.

Miss Seeton is drawn into a problem the police are having with two different thieves. In spite of themselves, the police come to her and request her help.

There is a "Ransom Raffles". He is a lone person who breaks into the homes of the very wealthy. He is daring in the way he enters homes by scaling walls, using ropes tied to chimneys and walking along window sills. After he steals very valuable small items, he then offers to return them to the owner. Of course there is a price. Even the methods he uses to receive his ransom are daring.

The other thefts are on a grander scale. Someone is stealing works of art. What is being stolen are anything from paintings to statues. There seems to be no rhyme or reason to these thefts, but they are frequent and daring. Rumors have it that the person behind these thefts is a reclusive millionaire from somewhere other than Britain.

In spite of the reluctance of the police, Miss Seeton becomes involved in both of these cases in different ways. As always, Miss Seeton is not certain of what is expected of her. But she also always helps solve problems by drawing what her heart sees in people and places.

Miss Seeton is an asset for the police department. Yet, she considers herself to be nothing more than an identikit artist. Her ability to unconsciously see into the hearts of people provides the police with hints about who and what to investigate.

Miss Seeton accidentally finds the solution to one case. With the other case, her automatic drawings show the answer to anyone who looks.

As always, we have glimpses of the villagers and their love of a good gossip. Miss Seeton's friends in the

police department are also strong supporting characters. But, in this book, we spend more time with Miss Seeton herself than in most of her stories.

Her talent for walking through life mostly untouched by the events surrounding her continues to be a strong part of this book. The humor which is a part of Miss Seeton, the police department and her village is strong enough to be considered a character in this story.

I enjoy these books and this one is no exception.

Scotland Yard is baffled. Thrudd Banner, freelance journalist extraordinaire, has exclusively linked various art thefts throughout Europe to one rich eccentric he has christened Croesus. The Art Fraud department has kindly provided Chief Inspector Delphick with a copy of their file and a subtext of seeking unorthodox help (which he ignores). At the same time Raffles The Ransomeer is raiding stately homes and holding precious heirlooms to ransom. The latest is at Belton Abbey and given Miss Seeton's rescue of their paintings a few years before (Miss Seeton Sings) they are keen to involve her again. Before long Miss Seeton is down at Belton doing her sketches and saving the day.

As usual Miss Seeton By Moonlight is a clever, amusing novel, a joy to read and I chuckled my through it. My one regret in it is that Superintendent Brinton of Ashford police does not make an appearance (he's always good for a few laughs) but as the cast of regular characters has widened over the series it is obviously not possible to include them all.

There is less slapstick in this novel with only one excellent scene near the end and rather more emphasis on the "psychic" drawings. The humour is more subtle as it comes from conversation and predicaments but no less amusing.

I have thoroughly enjoyed the Miss Seeton series as it provides some light entertainment and is an easy way to pass a few hours. Miss Seeton By Moonlight is a welcome addition to the series and I have no hesitation in recommending it as a good read.
