I've just finished reading all six books in The Soulkeeper series. It took me about a month to finish reading them. I'd already read the first three but wanted to read them all again, back to back.

Please note that this review is based on the books in their complete entirety.

I just adore the series & I know in years to come I'll probably re-read yet again & enjoy just as much. The first three books in the series were probably my absolute favourites, but the last three books and how it all ends certainly did not disappoint. You can definitely lose days reading these books, the whole concept of good versus evil & the seemingly endless & ongoing battle between God & the Devil is so thought provoking & relevant & I think that all of the characters, no matter how far-fetched some of their powers & challenges are, are still relatable.

Book 1 - The Soulkeepers (5 Stars)

A fabulous introduction to the series with Jacob as the main character throughout. I loved how the town of Paris & its inhabitants were portrayed... Small town, small minds & all that jazz, definitely great at setting the scene & pace of the story. I loved the mysteriousness of Dr. Abigail Silva & how her relationship with Jacob developed. I also liked the connection of the soulkeeper DNA with the story of Adam & Eve, it was very cleverly portrayed & offered deep insight for those who were looking for it. I immediately liked Malini, she seemed like an old soul, kind of born before her time, even in the beginning. Abigail & Gideon's history & consequently their love story cemented the book as a 5 star rating.

Some of my fav snippets from Book 1 ----->

"Across the street, the Victorian loomed black and blue, a bruise on the horizon. The wind rattled the ivy on the fence and knocked some icicles free. They fell like knives, slicing the snow-covered yard. Dead leaves swirled behind the wrought-iron fence. For a second, just a fraction of a moment, Jacob could've sworn he'd seen a face staring at him through the front window. He closed the garage door and hurried inside."

"I did the best I could to bury him. It was probably not deep enough. Not as deep anyway as they bury you in a cemetery, but he was my first grave. I buried him in the fall. The ground froze over that winter and I trudged through the snow to visit his grave. In the spring, I was ecstatic to find a sapling growing there. I knew then that his blood had unlocked deep magic."

"She says that God allowed water to flow out of the Garden of Eden, to reach the descendants of Adam and Eve. Only the ones who were pure of heart, who genuinely wanted to rid the world of evil, could see and drink the water. Those people who drank it experienced changes. It altered their DNA. I am a descendant of one of those children. Actually, more like two or more. See, the gifts were lost -- like recessive genes -- as the sons and daughters married normal people."

"I guess there are three types of Soulkeepers. There are Horsemen like me who are supposed to battle evil, like soldiers who protect humans. There are Healers that fix things, cure people and situations. And then there are Helpers, who serve the other two by getting them what they need. My gift, as far as I know, is that I

can control water. I guess that's a Horseman thing, a weapon."

"Evil things can get to our side. This is the part that I never really bought into. She says there are fallen angels among us. She calls them Watchers. Says they come to steal people's souls from God. That's why I'm a Horseman, to protect people's souls."

"The fallen ones are not of this Earth, Malini. They are under it. They live in a land of illusions, a land that is not with God but is a spiritual realm bound forever to this Earth. They live in a land where God sent Cain when he cursed him to wander. They live in Nod. They are connected to all living things through their wrongdoings. Sin attracts them. Why was the serpent in the garden? The woman brought him there. She was already thinking about taking the fruit; angry with God for the rules he had given Adam. Her pride opened the portal in the tree. She invited the serpent."

"Everyone is guilty, Malini, of something. The Watchers choose the important ones, the ones whose taking will leave a bigger space in the garden, so that more weeds can grow. They leave the weeds."

"So, it seems like you are doomed to experience one more form of hell today," she said softly. Then she held a hand out toward Gideon. "Witness, the curse of the angel who fell in love with the Watcher."

Book 2 - Weaving Destiny (5 Stars)

This is pretty much Malini's story & discovery of who she is & where / how she fits in with the team of Soulkeepers. It also introduces Mara & Henry - my two favourite characters of the whole series (along with Abigail & Gideon of course). Another 5 star rating!

Some of my favourite snippets ----->

"Because it taught me the power of my gift. I can stop time, Jacob. If I wanted to, I could walk into a bank and take all the money out of the open drawers. I could move someone I didn't like in front of a bus. I wear the SpongeBob pajamas so that I remember how it felt to watch someone I thought I wanted dead plunge a knife into her chest. I didn't like it, Jacob. SpongeBob reminds me to live by the rules even though I don't have to."

"What you are about to experience is both truth and illusion, the in-between world and the magic of the stone. Make no mistake. If you die on this journey, you die in real life and nothing can bring you back. Follow the path. Face the three challenges and return here before the stone turns black. Or don't, in which case I will say my goodbyes now. Goodbye, Malini."

"Those black eyes began to burn and in them she saw all manner of death: Fire, pestilence, war. They were like Fatima's eyes, windows into the history of the world, but with a much darker view."

"Destiny is not a place that we navigate to like a pinpoint on a map. Destiny is a fabric woven from our choices. It is the cloak we wear everyday and the shroud that covers us in our death. You can't wait for destiny to find you. You make it for yourself."

Book 3 - Return to Eden (5 Stars)

This is probably my favourite book out of all six books! I just completely adore the story of Mara and Henry. It's truly magical and precious. I literally lost days whilst reading this book, it completely enthralled me. A 5 star rating all the way!

Some of my favourite snippets ----->

"Silence wedged itself between them, but it wasn't because there was nothing left to say. The words that waited in the corners had sharp edges. Words like that could do permanent damage if flung too hard at the one you loved."

"I have been time for over two thousand years. You might say a change was in order." He chuckled. "But that would not explain why I chose you. It's true I'd heard of your love affair with Death and if I were a sentimental old fool that might be reason enough. I am not. Love is fleeting. Immortality is not." He stopped swinging his blade and met Mara's eyes. "You cannot quit being Time because you break up with your boyfriend."

"Time, Death and Fate are forever linked to each other, and have been friends of God from the beginning."

Book 4 - Soul Catcher (4 Stars)

This book pretty much centred around Dane & his growing relationship with Ethan. I admire author's who write about real-life issues & I empathised for Dane because he felt that he couldn't tell his parents/family/friends that he was gay. I think he must have felt very alone until he found Ethan, even amongst his soulkeeper friends. This book also introduced a new soul keeper called Cheveyo. I feel like I couldn't really connect with Cheveyo in the same way I had with the other characters & he was probably my least favourite character of the series.

Some of my favourite snippets ----->

"... have no doubt that in the future, the laws that criminalise so many forms of human love and commitment will look the way the apartheid laws do to us now -- so obviously wrong. Such a terrible waste of human potential... And never let anyone make you feel inferior for being who you are. When you live the life you were meant to live, in freedom and dignity, you put a smile on God's face. --Archbishop Desmond Tutu."

"Yes, he'd done some things he wasn't proud of, and this cage was good at reminding him of those things, but his true gifts shone like stars against the backdrop of his past. Right now, he couldn't waste another minute on the darkness."

Book 5 - Lost Eden (4 Stars)

Rest in Paradise Master Lee... Farewell to Abigail & Gideon :(they leave behind their daughter named Hope. Goodbye to Eden also...

Some of my favourite snippets ----->

"Those who choose evil must see the darkness for what it is, and those who choose good must know walking in the light does not come easily. There is a price, a responsibility, that comes with knowing the truth and

having a heart of peace and love."

"Courage is useless in the absence of anything to be courageous about."

Book 6 - The Last Soulkeeper (4 Stars)

Oh my goodness, what a finale! I loved the relationship between Bonnie & Archangel Cord and I was really pleased with how the series ended. I didn't really have any inkling of how it would all come to a conclusion, G P Ching kept me in suspense until the end. I also really liked the epilogue, although I almost choked when I read "8 years later," thinking no please don't ruin it!!! I especially enjoyed the introduction of the Wicked Brethren and the play on the seven deadly sins, pretty clever :)

Some of my favourite snippets ----->

"The seven Wicked Brethren were cursed to be the vessels of the seven deadly sins. Pride, lust, wrath, gluttony, sloth, envy and greed. All of their selfish wickedness multiplied exponentially upon their fall and populated their seven bodies with these vices."

"Maybe it's time for me to let it go," she said. "The you I hated does not exist anymore. I'm in hate with a ghost."

"All humans are made from God. They come from God. Each is a gift, just like me. But like me, some are disconnected from the piece of themselves that is eternal. A human soul is an ancient powerful thing. Cut a person off from their soul, and you make them a shell whose only purpose is their current unremarkable existence."
