I should offer a disclaimer at the start of this that I live in a town which not only hosts one of the oldest folk festivals in the country but is also home to five - yes that's five - different Morris sides.

So yes, I absolutely loved this book, it's only not a 5* read because I wanted more but, as is always the case from Jay, there is a beautifully rounded romance with seriously sexy scenes at the heart of this humorous tale.

Morris dancing is a much maligned traditional English pass time but its roots are deep in the heart of our culture, although there are debates as to its origins, and there is nothing which stirs the blood more than a side of Border Morris blackface painted men and women wielding sticks with precision as the beat of a bodhran keeps pace.

I know Jay is a member of a Morris side and this book shows the neat little insights and jokes as Rowan comes to realise that dancing with Seth might just be the best thing he's ever done.

So when Rowan is mouthing off to his friend about how obnoxious and lame and old and fat Morris dancers are, only to realize he's sitting *right next* to an entire group of them. A group that includes a hot guy he was ogling earlier in the night?

Yep. Been there. I mean, not *there* specifically, because like everyone else that read this story, I hadn't the foggiest idea what the hell Morris dancing even was when I started the story. But somewhere in the general vicinity - foot firmly in mouth regretting all my life choices (But still kind of feeling like I'm 100% *right*, I just regret having said it so loudly and insultingly. I also might just be an asshole.).

There were a lot of elements in this story that I recognized as Things That Are A Thing. Hookups are easy, connection is hard. A brief encounter with someone that sticks with you for whatever reason. A missed connection leaving you doubting something you thought was real.

So why only 3 stars? Because despite having all these things I recognized... intellectually, I didn't really *feel* it. Maybe it was too short. Maybe there was too much teachy time about the dance thing... or maybe it was the fact that I stopped in the middle to google Morris dancing and then promptly 100% agreed with Rowan's initial assessment of it and from that point forward had a supremely difficult time believing anything involving Morris dancing was sexy. At. All.

Whatever it was, no matter how much I read about Rowan feeling this connection and spark, *I* didn't really feel it.
