Book 5 of the Sovereign of the Seven Isles continues the story of Alexander's war against Phane and his attempts to restore the Old Law across the Seven Isles. The story continues from the point the last one ended in that Alexander is stuck on Tyr healing from wounds suffered whilst rescuing the stolen dragon's egg and Isobel is on the boat having left (fearing that Phane's latest plan might induce her to kill Alexander).

During the course of the story Alexander learns more about his magic and becomes able to project a talking image of himself when using his clairvoyance which enables him to keep himself all of the developments in the war. When used in conjunction with his clairvoyance he is able to guide Abigail and Isobel through their trials by scanning ahead and coming back to warn them. Abigail gets captured by Zuhl, is rescued and then sets out to free the remaining dragons under Zuhl control by cutting off their control collars using the Thinblade.

Isobel, whilst still fighting the influence of the Wraith Queen she sets off to confront and hopefully kill Phane. Captured in Karth she is taken before the Sin'Rath coven of witches. These effectively rule Karth having charmed the male rulers this not only gives them control but has convinced all the men that they are the most beautiful women they have ever seen (the truth as we discover is somewhat different). Having escaped their clutches she sets off to find the bones of a creature that was created to nullify magic so that having got close to Phane she will be able to kill him as his magical protection will not be working.

Another fast paced story where once again we see Abigail and Isobel taking the lead in the fight against Phane whilst Alexander recovers. There are some really interesting insights in personalities in the story. One where Abigail is trying to explain to Zuhl why there are helping people even at the risk of their own lives and he just doesn't get it. We also see the struggle that Alexander has with the baby dragon that hatched after he rescued it and thus imprinted on him and not her mother.

So here my review of the series, so far as I followed, put here at book #5, because that's the way, that made me finally give up.

I found the first half of the first book really boring, actually wanted to give up after the first third, but kept on reading out of boredom. The second half got a lot better, and was full of promise. So I got the second book, which wasn't really fulfilling the promises, but wasn't so bad. Then the third... and the fourth... Always not really bad, but not getting there either.

The storytelling is not really on a high level. The protagonist is acting often in a stupid way, just to open another part to talk about. Too many side quests ;-). Also, there are too many new monsters showing up all the time. Each different and new, half dragon here, half monkey there, it's just too much, like a recipe with too many spices. And the author repeats things all the time. One guy always stands around with his hands clasped behind back. Always. People who were sick, are then always "up and about". And many more such things. I gave up in the middle of book #5, which is really just awful.

One thing that completely didn't work for me was the shade's possession of a dragon. By his own description of what makes a host vulnerable to the shade, Wells makes this event seem unfathomable and un-buyable.

I admit that I was confused at the end of this book because I thought that the cursed bone (yes, the title means something) would aid Isabel's assassination attempt. It was nice to note that Phane might be powerful, but he isn't well-loved. In fact, if they thought they could get away with it, many of his "servants" would line up to kill the guy.
