As in the other titles in this series, it is essential to read the Expedition File since it offers useful tips about surviving a shark attack, what to do when you run out of water while diving, and some safety precautions while sailing. As you make certain choices, you move from one part of the book to the next, jumping back and forth, with some paths ending in disaster. I'm not sure how many possible endings there are. The cover says 28, and the introduction says 33, but either way, this book will keep readers guessing and hold their interest. Some of the "mysteries" aren't all that mysterious since they have simple explanations, but still, it's fun to take this voyage.
